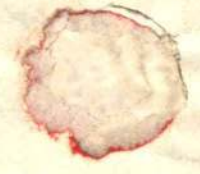

Liverpool April 27th 1831

My dear Mr Madge

By my letter of yesterday you would find that we had arrived safe, after a very pleasant journey but on our arrival Miss Jane Barton was quite knocked up by a severe head ache and sickness, she kept her bed the whole of the next day, and has only sallied forth for the first time this morning; - On passing thro Preston we saw the entree of Mr. Brown, but such a set of Raggid, dirt, blackguards I never before saw collected together, Brown himself rode on the dicky of a chaise and seemed quite in his place, he was a good deal kissed, and does not seem so great a favorite as he was.

We also saw the other members for Preston who seem, a very decent set of a young man; Liverpool is all in a ferment, I never saw it in such a state they are at this moment holding a meeting in the

Music Room but it will not hold a tythe of those who
wish to attend, there is a very general wish to turn out
Gascogne out, but he has the Mayor's seat of the town
Order of Doctors in his favor, there will be one of the warmest
contests ever known, it does not commence until next
Monday so that you will be glad that I shall be out
of the hustle, the pictures will I expect be finished
to-morrow, and will look better than I expected.

John Haswell has found a Paper amongst his father's
which fully establishes the connexion of your father's family
with the Holt estate, it is an account of the payment
of eight hundred and ten Pounds, which seems to me to be
a compensation in lieu of Dowry, due to your great
Grandmother, but to-morrow I have to see Mr. Leigh who
father seems to have been the Attorney upon the Occasion.

My Visit to Chudwell was very satisfactory, the
register confirmed the Abstract which I have got but
I do not wonder at your father's name being omitted
for I could hardly from the bad spelling (Baxter)

and so negligent has your good Mama been that neither
his name or his Mother's is put on the Green stone
but I have given orders to have them put on, the
Graves of which there are two are in the chancel End
and are the next to the Communion Table, there
is a very good Ped Seal attached to the Wall Entate
so that they have been somebody in their Day, the
Stark of the Church says that the name is ~~is~~ considered
as very old one by the Country folks, I have this
Morning been buying some Ped China which I ^{for}
hope Mr. Antist will like, your Commission
I have not yet executed I must have some one
with me, I went with Miss Ann Barton into a
Dyeing Shop yesterday without being able to succeed
for Mr. John Gandy, Barton and I dined with Mr.

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your
respective letters of the 26th Sep 1848 & 13th Jan^{ly} and as your
justly conjecture, the reason I have not replied to your
former letter has been that I expected to have had
the pleasure of seeing you in Liverpool — from the
Statement you have received from Mr Boston, I ima-
gine, that the Mr Butler of Rowcliffe who married Miss
Gosington was the Father of Henry Butler, unless he had
a former Wife to Miss Curran, from whom I am descended.
I shall have great pleasure in seeing Mr Boston in case
he comes over to Liverpool to take of a family dinner
with me to talk over these matters. I find on enquiry
that the Bostons were possessors of Holt Hall
near Holton, where they resided many Years — this
property is now held by Mr Rawson of this place —
I am acquainted with a Mr Bostington who is the Son
of the late Mr B of Ince who can give you a good
deal of information relative to the family. I should
spoken to him & when you come over here I will
introduce you to him — please make my best

respects to Mr Yates, who I am glad to find is enjoying better
health than when I saw him at Harrogate and also
to Mr Darton - It will afford me great pleasure to see
you on Sunday, which I hope will not be delayed
much longer than the operation of Lent when I can see
you at my House - Farewell

I think that this Pedigree may be considered as proved from James Brettache & Deborah his wife to their great grandson John Brettache who died in 1779. It will be desirable however that copies of the wills mentioned should be procured, as the abstracts are not very clear. The issue given to John, abovementioned, require to be somewhat corroborated as the evidence of their baptisms is scarcely sufficient for their identification; and the affiliation of William Brettache who died in 1804 to Henry must be identified.

Edward Brettarghe, Nehemiah Brettarghe, Thomas Brettarghe, George Brettarghe, Jonathan Brettarghe, all died infants.

John Richards of Liverpool Co Lanc: Surgeon & of Barbadoes Town in the County of Barbadoes. Died in Jamaica 1798. Buried at Kingston.

Jane 3rd dau & coheir of Tho: Yeates of Kendal, Solicitor, Married at St. Anne's Liverpool, Died 24 March 1830 Bur: at Kirkstall Maughdale Church.

William Brettarghe of Liverpool Co. Lancaster, Gent. Buried at Childwall the 23 Nov 1804, aged 28. There is no evidence at present to show that he was the son of Henry. His Uncle's Will might establish the fact

Margaret dau of John Kendall of Lancaster, Married at St. Paul's Church, Liverpool 6 Oct 1794, Died March 27, 1832. Buried at Worsley in the County of Surrey.

John Richards of Kirkland in the Parish of Kendal Co Westmorland, In the Commission of the Peace for the Borough of Kendal & for the County of Westmorland 1837 Took the Name & Arms of Yeates only by Royal Sign Manual dated 31 May 1837.

Margaretta eldest dau & coheir Baptizd at Liverpool - 1802. Married at St. Bennet Fincke London 6 Aug: 1805.
